#### WHAT IS COURAGE?



Courage International, Inc., is an apostolate of the Roman Catholic Church which offers pastoral support to men and women experiencing same-sex attractions who have chosen to live a chaste life. Founded in 1980 by Fr. John Harvey, OSFS, at the request of the late Terence Cardinal Cooke, it has since expanded to over 175 Courage chapters worldwide. On November 28, 2016, Courage International, received canonical status in the Roman Catholic Church as a diocesan clerical public association of the faithful, making it the only canonically-approved apostolate of its kind.

#### 5 Goals of Courage

- 1. To live chaste lives in accordance with the Roman Catholic Church's teaching on homosexuality;
- 2. To dedicate our entire lives to Christ through service to others, spiritual reading, prayer, meditation, individual spiritual direction, frequent attendance at Mass, and the frequent reception of the sacraments of Reconciliation and Holy Eucharist;
- 3. To foster a spirit of fellowship in which we may share with one another our thoughts and experiences, and so ensure that no one will have to face the problems of homosexuality alone;
- 4. To be mindful of the truth that chaste friendships are not only possible but necessary in a chaste Christian life; and to encourage one another in forming and sustaining these friendships;
- 5. To live lives that may serve as good examples to others

the need arise. Please keep the following in mind when parking on campus:


- Park only in designated parking spaces including in the lot near the parish office

THE FEAST OF MERCY - A DAY OF EXTRAORDINARY GRACE

The First Sunday after Easter, April 7

In a series of revelations to St. Maria Faustina Kowalska in the 1930s, our Lord repeatedly called for the celebration of the Feast of Divine Mercy on the first Sunday after Easter. He promised an ocean of graces to be poured upon the world. Today, we know this feast as Divine Mercy Sunday, named by St. John Paul II at the canonization of St. Faustina on April 30, 2000.

"I desired that the first Sunday after Easter be the Feast of Mercy" (299). "On that day the very depths of My tender mercy are opened. I pour out a whole ocean of graces upon the souls who approach the Fount of My Mercy."

Every family needs God's mercy. Lenten prayers, fasts, alms giving and good deeds afford us the opportunity to prepare well for extraordinary graces on Divine Mercy Sunday.

"No soul that has called up on My mercy has ever been disappointed or put to shame" (1541).

### Jesus to St. Faustina:

"My daughter, tell the whole world about My inconceivable mercy. The soul that will go to Confession and receive Holy Communion shall obtain complete forgiveness of sins and punishment. On that day all the divine floodgates through which graces flow are opened. Let no soul fear to draw near to Me, even though its sins be as scarlet."

#### How to Receive the Graces of Divine Mercy

To receive the graces, the only condition is to receive Holy Communion worthily on Divine Mercy Sunday (or the Vigil celebration) by making a good confession beforehand and staying in a state of grace and trusting in His Divine Mercy.

Adoration: 9:30 a.m. - 12:30 p.m. | St. Mary's Chapel Confessions: 9:30 a.m. - 12:30 p.m. | St. Mary's Chapel Bride's Room

By these conditions, our Lord emphasizes the value of confession and Holy Communion, as miracles of mercy. The Eucharist is Jesus, Himself, the Living God, longing to pour Himself as Mercy into our hearts. In addition, if we want to receive mercy, we must be merciful. Our Lord told St. Faustina:

"Yes, the first Sunday after Easter is the Feast of Mercy, but there must also be acts of Mercy" (742).

# March Happenings



































My name is Lauren Wilhelm and I am in 10th grade at Holy Spirit Prep. This is my 11th year in Girl Scouts and I am in the process of earning my Gold Award.

For my Gold Award Project, I am working with Catholic Charities Atlanta Refugee group. Catholic Charities Atlanta is an organization that provides transformative services that empower families to overcome barriers and achieve self-sufficiency. One of their biggest areas of assistance is helping settle legal refugees when they come to Atlanta.

My Gold Award project is to collect much needed laundry necessities and to educate my community on the situation legal refugees face. I plan to collect and assemble at least 50 laundry basket kits which will contain a plastic laundry basket, laundry detergent, fabric softener, dryer sheets, and stain remover spray. The laundry kits will be given to Catholic Charities who will distribute to refugee families newly arriving in the United States.

Donations will be accepted in the HSCC Narthex between April 10 and April 30.
